Mechanicsburg Center WRAP Program

Each week a group of 8 to 10 members at the Mechanicsburg Center gather to work through the WRAP Program. WRAP - Wellness Recovery Action Plan - is a 10 to 12 week structured system that supports members in developing their own customized plan. Members are guided by certified instructors in identifying components in their lives such as what maks a good day, triggers, and symptoms, as well as steps to take if they feel unwell. The plan, developed by Dr. Mary Ellen Kopeland, empowers members. They take responsibility in the steps for both staying well and asking for assistance in time to avoid a crisis. Aurora Staff Lisa Ratcliff Webb and Member Staff Teresa Kerns guide the program.
